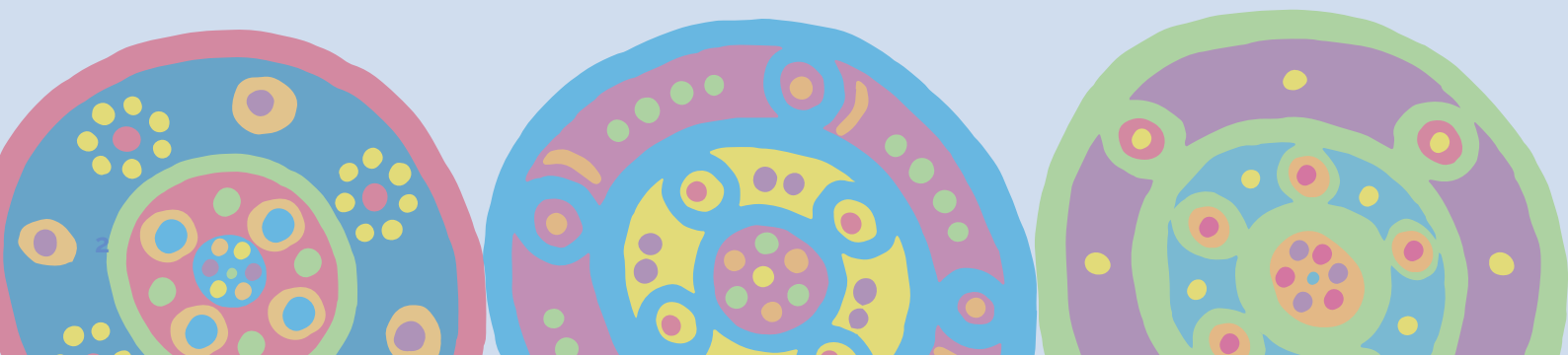

Our Motif

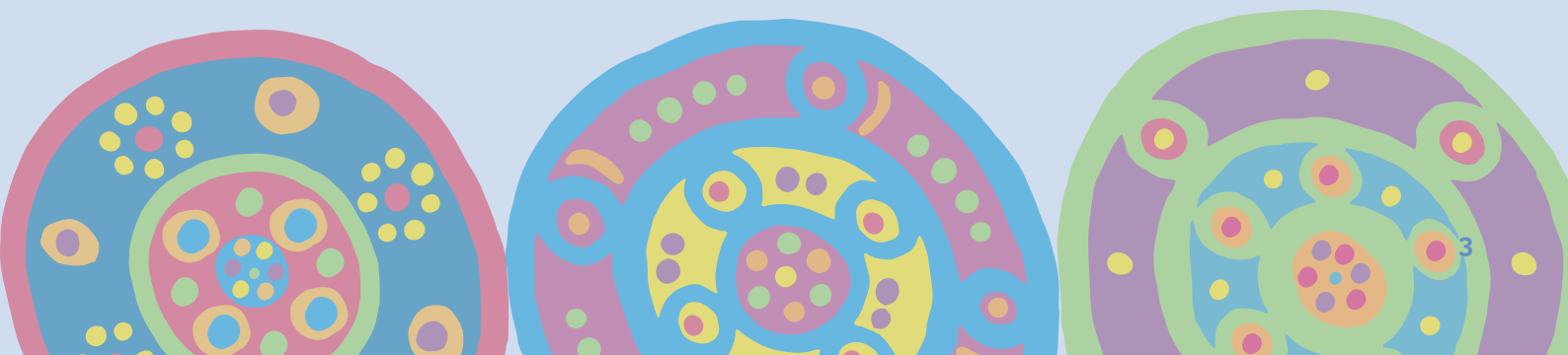

A message from our Chair and CEO

2022 gave us new hope, new challenges and new successes to celebrate at Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) North Australia.

One of our proudest moments of 2022 was the official opening of our Ronald McDonald Family Room at Mackay Base Hospital. We extend a special thanks to our partners, Mackay Hospital and Health Service and Mackay Hospital Foundation, for your unwavering support for this new practical care program. We also give our special thanks to Flagon & Dragon Mackay, Fergus Builders, Ronald McDonald House Charities Australia and Mackay McDonald's Licensee, Niki Ramsay, for your dedicated support.

Foremost, we would like to extend our gratitude and acknowledgment to our Board, staff, volunteers, Advisory Group and stakeholders whose dedication and significant contributions allowed us to further our Mission.

Across our five distinct programs, we are proud to support thousands of sick and injured children, and their families, when they need it most. The support we provide for families across the entire North Australia region would not be possible without our dedicated team of volunteers. At RMHC North Australia, our volunteers are the heart of the Charity. Whether it is keeping the grounds clean and tidy or washing the linen at the House, talking to a parent in need of a listening ear, or pushing the RMHC Hospitality Cart through the Mount Isa Hospital, our volunteers are the key to keeping our programs in operation, and we could not do it without them.

At RMHC, our practical care extends beyond a child's time in Hospital through the Ronald McDonald Learning Program. In 2022, we were pleased to see an incredible 113 students provided with free tutoring on the Learning Program. 26% of children supported identified as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander, a 2% increase since 2021. We were also delighted to have a local North Australian winner of the RMHC Charlie Bell Scholarship, Will Carland, from Mount Isa. He is excited to be commencing a Bachelor of Biomedical Science at the University of Queensland in 2023. The \$5,000 scholarship funds will make a real difference in giving Will the education boost he deserves after battling leukemia as a child.

At RMHC North Australia, fundraising is critical across every facet of our Charity, from keeping the lights on in our House to our continued program growth. We were humbled by the generosity of our local

community; the support extended to our events and appeals, and the unwavering in-kind support our community provides; from essential pantry items, to toys and donated advertising. Our Corporate Volunteers also provide RMHC North Australia with invaluable support, cooking our families meals through our Feast with Friends and Meals from the Heart initiatives. Having access to a nutritious, home-cooked meal can make a world of difference for families caring for a seriously sick or injured child.

RMHC North Australia was honoured to again see the renewal of our partnership with long-time supporters, Queensland Country Bank in 2022. We truly value the friendships we have forged with Queensland Country Bank and other countless corporate supporters who continue to make such a significant impact on the Charity.

We also give our heartfelt thanks to our Mission Partner, McDonald's, across North Queensland and the Northern Territory. Their continued support, advocacy and devotion to the Charity throughout 2022 is sincerely appreciated.

We also thank our service partners at Townsville University Hospital, Mackay Base Hospital and Mount Isa Hospital, for prioritising the delivery of wholistic family centred care, hand in hand with RMHC North Australia.

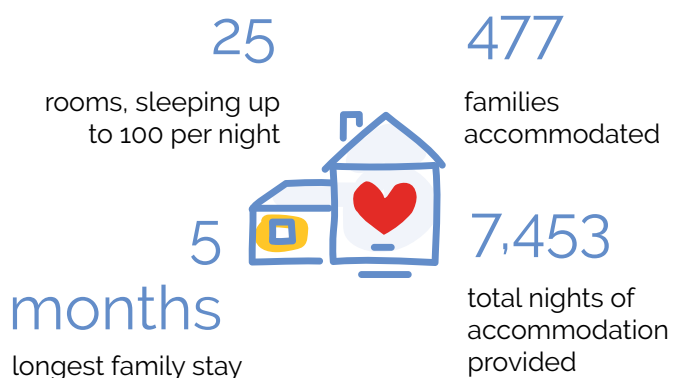

Keeping Families Close

Ronald McDonald House



Providing welcoming, supportive and free accommodation for North Australian families with a seriously sick or injured child, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

For families who don't live close to Townsville University Hospital, being able to stay close by and involved in their child's treatment makes an immense difference.

Ronald McDonald House is just a short walk away from Townsville University Hospital and provides essential accommodation and practical support so families can focus on their child's recovery.

The Bavister Family

Cairns based parents Alex and Ash Bavister stayed at Ronald McDonald House Townsville when their four and a half month old son, Myles, became seriously ill.

"As a parent of a very sick child, you would sleep in the Hospital waiting room if you had to. But instead, I was greeted with a modern, fresh clean room with everything you could need. It wasn't until the following morning did I realise that RMHC North Australia not only provided parents and families with a room to stay, but a home away from home," Alex explained.

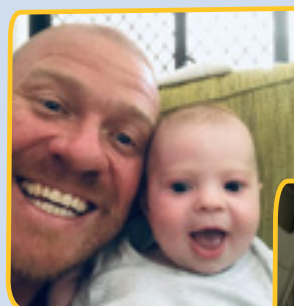
"Being able to spend time with our son Theo and other family members in a home environment away from the Hospital was so important to us at the time.

Tragically, Alex and Ash had to say goodbye to their beautiful baby boy Myles on Wednesday 16th October, 2019.

"Upon returning to Cairns Ash and I felt driven to create good from our loss," Alex explained.

Alex and Ash planned to Adopt-a-Room with RMHC North Australia, with the goal to raise \$5,000. Three years later, thanks to their generous support, and the support of their friends, family and local businesses, such as Norweld, Goodstart Kanimbla Daycare and the Bresnahan Foundation, the family have raised \$50,000. This equates to 10 years of Adopt-a-Room sponsorship. Alex and Ash are determined to continue their fundraising journey for Myles.

"Our drive to continue to fundraise for such an impactful Charity is not only to have Myles' name on a plaque, but it is to ensure this amazing and irreplaceable service is available to any future family that needs it," Alex said.



A Home within the Hospital

Ronald McDonald Family Room

Giving families with a seriously sick or injured child a place to relax and recharge, without leaving the Hospital.

The Ronald McDonald Family Room program provides a refuge for families visiting or staying with a child in Hospital.

The Family Room is where families can step away from the often clinical environment of the Hospital, and instead enter a calming, welcoming and home-like space.

The Ronald McDonald Family Rooms at Townsville University Hospital and Mackay Base Hospital are equipped with a kitchen, lounge room, laundry, bathrooms, sleeping rooms and play areas.



Thanks to the generous support of the local Mackay, Isaac and Whitsunday community, RMHC North Australia proudly opened the Ronald McDonald Family Room at Mackay Base Hospital on Thursday the 8th December, 2022, after three years of fundraising. This new facility is the first of its kind in Mackay.

Getting better shouldn't mean falling behind

Ronald McDonald Learning Program

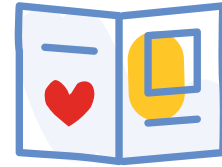
Many children who have been seriously sick or injured are forced to be absent from school for a significant length of time while they focus on getting better. This can lead them to fall behind in their education. Returning to the classroom can be tough – both academically and socially.

The Ronald McDonald Learning Program provides children who have suffered a serious illness or injury with up to 40 hours of free, one-on-one tutoring with a qualified teacher. Children are paired with a teacher who is best suited to their learning style and educational needs.

Will's story - RMHC Charlie Bell Scholarship recipient

The annual RMHC Charlie Bell Scholarship provides grants of \$5,000 to students between the ages of 15 – 20 years old to assist them with their tertiary education.

Will was diagnosed with leukemia as a young child. As a result, he has been in and out of Hospital most of his life, causing him to miss a significant portion of his schooling.

"Missing that much school has made it really hard to keep up, but I am lucky enough to have fantastic support from my teachers and family to get me through. I want to give back to my community [in Mount Isa] in the way of being able to provide help for all those who need it, the patient and the family. To be able to bring my knowledge back to my rural area, to help provide excellent health care to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. My parents have put a lot of their lives on hold for me and financially have gone through a lot, I would love to be able to help with the help of this scholarship."

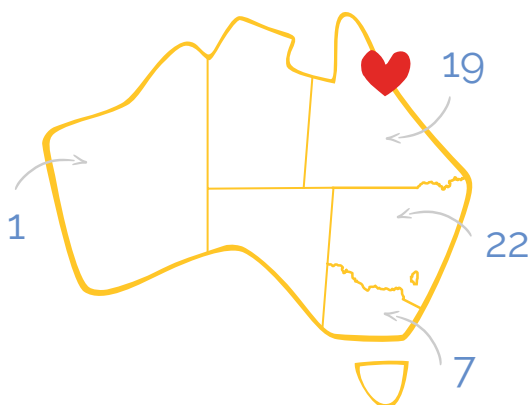

Ruby & Lincoln's story

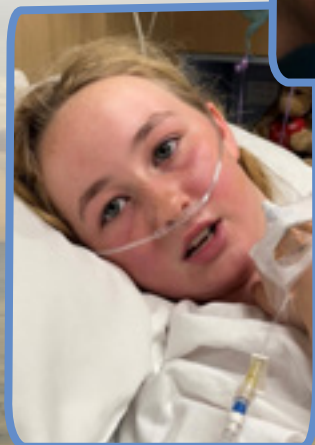
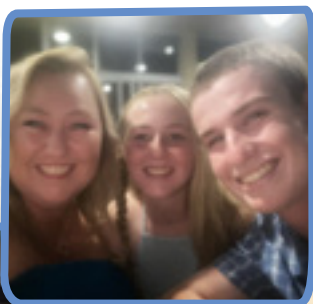
Both of Rebecca's children, Ruby and Lincoln, have endured many years of illness.

Practical support, direct to families

RMHC Hospitality Cart

Children receiving treatment at the Hospital can experience a range of emotions, from fear, to boredom, to loneliness. The RMHC Hospitality Cart provides practical support and comfort to sick children and their families at Mount Isa Hospital.



Our dedicated team of Volunteers take the RMHC Hospitality Cart through the Paediatric Ward and Special Care Nursery, delivering care items to sick kids and their families, including:

- Boredom-busters such as books, craft activities and entertainment for patients, siblings and their family, as well as learning activities and resources with a patient focus, to help reduce the educational impact of missing learning milestones
- Practical care items such as toiletries and comfort items including eye masks, earplugs and socks for families
- Snacks and beverages

Queensland Country Bank

The smooth operation of the RMHC Hospitality Cart is largely thanks to the generous support of our Charity Partner, Queensland Country Bank, who take time out of their week to deliver care items from the Cart to sick and injured children at Mount Isa Hospital.

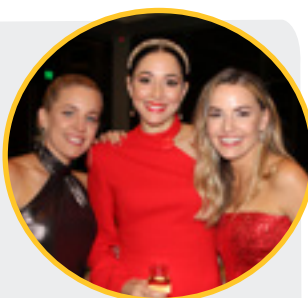

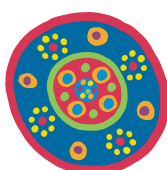
